

# How to Organize Your WordPress Media using FireBird WordPress Plugin

FireBird is a WordPress plugin that allows you to categorize WordPress media library with folders.

Let's be honest — the WordPress Media Library is powerful, but it's also kind of a mess once your site starts growing. If you've ever tried to find an image from three months ago, you know the struggle. WordPress doesn't offer a built-in way to organize your media into folders — everything just gets dumped into one giant bucket. That's where the **FireBird WordPress plugin** comes in.

FireBird adds a much-needed folder system to your WordPress Media Library, helping you stay organized and making your workflow way more efficient.

## The Problem: WordPress Media Chaos

By default, WordPress handles media in a very basic way. You upload an image, and it gets stored in a year/month folder behind the scenes — but you don't really see that structure from the admin dashboard. The Media Library just lists everything in a long scroll (or grid) of uploads. There's no way to:

- Group assets by client, project, or category
- Create folders or subfolders
- Quickly find related images or files
- Drag and drop files into an organized structure

This might be fine for small blogs, but if you're running an e-commerce store, a portfolio site, or managing multiple clients? It becomes a nightmare.

## FireBird: WordPress Media Folder Organization Made Easy

**FireBird** is a free (with premium upgrades) WordPress plugin that adds a simple, folder-based interface to your Media Library. Once installed, you'll be able to create folders just like you would on your computer — drag files into them, rename folders, and even sort by project or purpose.

Here's what FireBird brings to the table:

- **Folder UI directly inside the Media Library:** You'll see a folder tree on the left-hand side — just like Finder on macOS or File Explorer on Windows.
- **Easier file management:** No more endless scrolling. You can click into a folder to view just the files you need.
- **Create, rename, and delete folders:** Full control over your folder structure without needing to touch the file system.
- **Assign files to folders with drag-and-drop:** Move things around easily with intuitive controls.
- **Works with Gutenberg and classic editor:** When you go to add media in a post or page, you can access your folders right there.

## Getting Started with FireBird

Installing FireBird is just like any other WordPress plugin:

1. Head to **Plugins > Add New**
2. Search for **FireBird**
3. Click **Install Now**, then **Activate**

Once it's installed, go to your **Media Library**, and you'll immediately notice a new folder pane on the left.

From there, it's super simple:

- Click **+ Add Folder** to create a new folder
- Name it something logical (like "Client X" or "Landing Page Assets")
- Drag and drop files into the right folder
- Boom — organization!
