


# Update: Override Demo Parameters

WPDemo platform has supported demo parameters overriding but that wasn't properly documented. When You re on the Demo Page tab you can check what parameters you can send to the demo page that will be later forwarded to the backend servers.

## Dynamically Override Parameters

You can pass the following parameters to the demo link in case you want to override the setup's current values.

You can use **{site\_url}** and **{admin\_url}** placeholders like you did on the Landing Page tab.

**redirect\_url** - Change where the users will land after the site has been set up.

**buy\_now\_url** - Change the Buy Now URL shown in the top right corner in the WP admin bar.

**support\_url** - Change the Support URL shown in the top right corner in the WP admin bar.

## Examples

Redirect to a different page the after site set up landing page

```
https://wpdemo.net/try?id=uqrb_sqhj&redirect_url=SOME_URL_ENCODED_URL
```

Redirect to a page on the public side of the newly set up site. Applicable to full site demos or 'sample-page' for default WP install.

```
https://wpdemo.net/try?id=uqrb_sqhj&redirect_url={site_url}/my-landing-page
```

Redirect to another admin page that your theme/plugin has registered using `add_menu_page()` or `add_submenu_page()` functions.

```
https://wpdemo.net/try?id=uqrb_sqhj&redirect_url={admin_url}/admin.php?page=my_plugin_admin_about_page
```

**Note:** We highly recommend that you use `php's urlencode()` or `rawurlencode()` functions in your code so the values are correctly received by to the backend servers. This is especially important if the new URL has parameters as well e.g. `site.com/page?id=123`
